With all ASEAN nations represented at Expo, our site is packed with pavilions that showcase the region's cultural diversity, rich heritage and massive potential for economic growth and development.

Below are pavilion highlights curated for you.

ASEAN (ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIAN NATIONS)

The ASEAN Pavilion is a portal to a region where diversity is not a source of animosity but a motivation for tolerance, respect and appreciation of difference. Walking through the pavilion, you will enjoy a curated showcase of ASEAN artworks and artefacts that introduces people from all over the world to the region's creative and historical heritage.

BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

Visiting Brunei Darussalam's pavilion feels like being on the Temburong Bridge, the longest bridge in Southeast Asia and largest infrastructure project Brunei Darussalam has ever undertaken. The immersive experiences in the pavilion see you journey through the country's past, present and future, as deep feelings of peace accompany your every step.

CAMBODIA

You will experience three distinct areas in the Cambodia Pavilion: the Ancient Cultural exhibition; the Natural Ecosystem and Agricultural exhibition; and the Modern Cultural and Economics section. Together, the zones combine to produce a rich narrative of Cambodia's culture – from detailing Cambodian farming practices to the lifestyle of present-day Cambodian people and economic developments. This includes an immersive walk-through of some of Cambodia's loveliest beaches to showcase its tourism potential.

INDONESIA

Explore Indonesia's infrastructural development that is improving the lifestyle and prosperity of its people; its role in developing science and technology; and the ways in which the country is sharing its local wisdom and innovations with the world.

LAOS

The Laos Pavilion showcases a country imbued with a deep respect for its past while looking firmly to the future. It also brings visitors up close with the country's natural and manmade wonders, while showing how, thanks to its strategic location at the heart of Asia, its young, educated population, and its thriving innovation and vibrant cultural scene, Laos is perfect for tourists and investors alike.

MALAYSIA

At 130 million years old, Malaysia's Taman Negara is one of the oldest tropical rainforests in the world, and in the country's pavilion you will learn how the forest will be kept healthy for 130 million years more. The pavilion, a net-zero structure designed like a rainforest canopy, takes you on a

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digitally enhanced rainforest trek to explore Malaysia's commitment to balancing economic and environmental health. On your way out, be sure to enjoy authentic Malaysian delicacies at either of its two restaurants, or a performance in the outdoor amphitheatre.

MYANMAR

Designed by a university student in West Yangon Technological University, this pavilion is enabling visitors from around the world to encounter the beauty of Myanmar's diverse people and culture. It also inspires self-reflection and introspection with its narrow passages that guide visitors on an inspiring journey through five zones that reflect the country's rich heritage.

PHILIPPINES

'Dive' right into the Philippines' aquatic wonderlands. This pavilion is an imaginative coral village packed with artistic wonders and a powerful message about safeguarding marine life. But the marvels don't stop there: you can also explore immersive art installations, take selfies in front of a massive, graphically enhanced Filipino sailboat and enjoy authentic local cuisines.

SINGAPORE

This lushly landscaped, net-zero energy pavilion showcases how Singapore has overcome geographic limitations to become a green, liveable and resilient city of the future. Echoing the country's vision of a 'City in Nature', the open-air pavilion, which unfolds across 1,500 square metres of tropical plant life, lets you sample the diverse flavours of Singapore at the Sky Market, marvel at leafy vistas from the Canopy Walk, or just take a deep breath and enjoy the garden's calming quiet.

THAILAND

Taking inspiration from Thailand's iconic welcoming flower garland, the Thai pavilion enables visitors to experience Thailand's warm hospitality, culture and traditions, as well as its natural beauty. In the pavilion you can also take a journey through Thailand's past, present and future by exploring the country's digital infrastructure and creative advances in the fields of transportation, logistics, digital connectivity and personal mobility.

VIETNAM

Vietnam's pavilion features everything from traditional folk art to cutting-edge virtual reality technology and delicious local cuisine. It takes visitors on a journey that reveals Vietnam as a model of sustainable development, where diverse cultures, rich traditions and modern achievements thrive in harmony.
